



# International Capacity Building Seminar Development, teaching & assessment of interprofessional competences



# 16-18 March, 2016 💁 Ghent, Belgium

#### Goals

This seminar provides the opportunity to explore and discuss concepts on coaching and supervising students during the process of interprofessional learning. Participants acquire tools and methods to effectively conceptualize courses, learning paths and assessment methods for interprofessional competences. They learn to evaluate and assure the quality of interprofessional courses in health and social care.

## Target group

Academics from health & social care departments in higher education institutions (universities and university colleges), professional trainers and coaches in clinical settings.

#### **Trainers**

The experts come from four leading institutions who have a long tradition and built-up expertise in interprofessional education: University of Linköping (Sweden), Oulu University of Applied Sciences & University of Oulu (Finland), University of Ljubljana (Slovenia), and Artevelde University College & University of Ghent (Belgium). All experts have authored chapters in the volume *Interprofessional Education in Europe: Policy and Practice* (2015).

#### Sessions and visits

The programme includes training sessions and visits to a rehabilitation centre and a community health care centre. Also visits to Ghent city and a dinner are included.

# Registration

The number of participants is limited. Participation is guaranteed when registering before February 25<sup>th</sup> (50€ is added to later registrations). Payment is to be received before March 15<sup>th</sup>. Applicants need to contact isabelle.delariviere@arteveldehs.be The fee for non-members is 400€. Staff of Institutions who are member of COHEHRE or EIPEN pay 300€. In there is a combined membership of both COHEHRE and EIPEN there is a reduced fee of only 250€. Staff of low-income countries benefit an additional 50€ reduction. The fee covers participation, documents, lunches, and a dinner. Participants need to cover their own travel and hotel arrangements. Suggested hotels are Gravensteen, Parkhotel, NH Hoteles, Novotel, and Ibis.
